

Your little screen to your Smart TV:

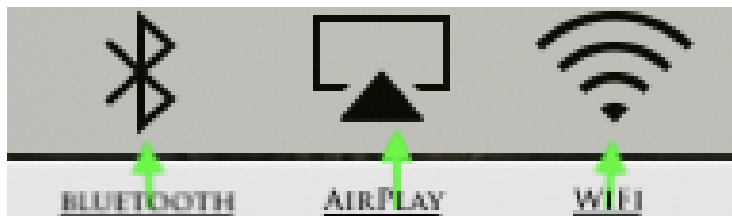
As many of us age, we may have trouble looking at detailed content, like our woodturning demonstrations, on our small screen devices. There is a solution if you have kept your home audio video system up to date with a “Smart TV”. Smart TV’s are pretty ubiquitous these days, and other than Superbowl Sunday party size bigguns, they are reasonably priced, at least in comparison to the “old days”.

One of our members recently thought it would be a good idea to make sure our members know that this is available to most device pairs, both Apple based as well as Android/PC based.

How do you connect your device to your Smart TV?

Almost all semi recent devices we use have a built-in utility called AirPlay in the Apple world. Android devices and PC’s call it casting in chrome casting or google cast in Windows 10. Screen mirroring is another term possibly used.

For Apple devices look for the AirPlay symbol on the device you want to “project” from:



Click on the AirPlay icon and a pull down should show your airplay capable smart TV. Click on it and the screen of the TV should mirror what is on your device. Sound should automatically transfer to the Smart TV as well.
